- **Survey: H2IOSC WP2 Landscaping Questionnaire**

This questionnaire, created by the Work Package 2 team of the PNRR-IR H2IOSC project (<https://www.h2iosc.cnr.it/>), aims to gain a deeper understanding of, and engage with, the communities in the humanities, social sciences, and cultural heritage. It targets all scholars, including students, researchers, professors, and experts in these fields. The focus is on exploring how they use and create data resources, technologies, software, and services in their research, their familiarity with research infrastructures, their training needs and desires, and their publication habits.

The survey – concluded on October 15, 2024 – is part of the Prin 2022 ROADS project. It aims to identify oral archives at Italian public universities, focusing on sociolinguistics, dialectology, and oral history, with the goal of providing a valuable resource for researchers while enhancing the visibility and preservation of these archives. Although the public review has concluded, the academic community is still invited to submit any missing archives or projects by contacting the project coordinators ([prin2022-progettoroads@unisi.it](mailto:prin2022-progettoroads@unisi.it)). The results have been presented in the autumn 2024 and made available on CLARIN-IT and through the General Archives Directorate to ensure long-term preservation and visibility.

Organized by the Modena Historical Institute, it presents significant national projects and theoretical reflections on oral sources. The event also examines the public, educational, and digital uses of oral testimonies related to the Resistance from 1943 to 1945.

The conference focuses on memories and narratives around the practices of deinstitutionalization in Italy. It aims to discuss the genesis and forms of the individual stories and personal accounts of the asylum collected and used from the 1960s to the present, highlighting the connotations of gender, geography, chronology, circulation, reception and intergenerational transmission. The conference is part of the PRIN 2022 *Narration and care. The deinstitutionalization of the psychiatric system in Italy: history, imagery, projects (from 1961 to the present)*, organized by the Universities of Cagliari, Turin, and Pisa.
